Vow Homework

To create personalized, perfect vows, you need to think about your relationship. Use these questions to start the process of thinking about what you want to say to each other as you say your vows. Sit down, when you are both open and honestly have a discussion so you can write down how you feel about each other.

What did you think about each other when you first met?

When did you first know you were in love?

When did you first know you'd marry this person?

When and where did you first say "I love you?"

Did others know you were in love before you both realized it or expressed it?

What do you love and admire most about the other person? (List about 10 things for each other)

What has your partner brought to your life that you didn't have before?

What characteristics and qualities do you think you've developed as a result of being together?

What challenges have the two of you overcome that have led to this point in your relationship?

What does his/her family mean to you?

Are there any special moments that you shared with his/her family that stand out that perhaps showed you more of your partner's depth and qualities?

What lessons about love and commitment have you learned from one another? From each other's families?

Who serves as your relationship role model; that couple with the deep love you wish to emulate? What is it about their relationship that you admire?

How do you see yourselves working through the challenges that lie ahead on the path of your life together?

What are five ways you'd describe your partner to your very best friend?

What do you promise to bring to your future children some day?

What are the five key ingredients to a successful marriage?

What are your goals, visions, and wishes for your future life together?
